Project History:

The Church of the Good Shepherd was originally designed and constructed in 1991 to serve a growing parish of some 1,600 people. Millard, Inc. consulted with the Catholic Archdiocese of Atlanta in the Master Planning phase for the parish and subsequently became the Architect of Record for the entire project. The original scope of work included the main sanctuary, family life center, rectory, and a small educational wing. The project was noted at the time for its value for the parish's construction dollar and pastoral setting created by the use of glass throughout the building.

Over the ensuing years Millard, Inc.'s services were retained for various additions and renovations. In 2012 we began planning for a Sanctuary Expansion and Renovation. Construction began in October of 2013 and completed in the Summer of 2014. Program highlights include 100% Sanctuary capacity increase, new choir loft, new focal entrance tower, new larger chapel, renovated restrooms, new fire sprinkler system, and improved support spaces. Response to the dramatic transformation of the existing church has been overwhelmingly positive.
